WHO WE ARE

The LKDF has been working to bridge the industrial skills gap since its founding in 2012. Established by UNIDO and the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida), the platform cooperates with business partners to establish or improve local industrial training academies and centers that prepare young people to fill the jobs available locally. We exist to address the mismatch in skills produced by TVET systems and the skills that are in demand in the labor markets.

The long-term success of local industrial academies that partner with the LKDF is ensured through constant monitoring of economic, environmental and social impact. UNIDO manages the facility, on behalf of the LKDF partners.


